SUMMARY CV

Vinod Tewari, Ph.D. from the Delhi School of Economics, Delhi University, has worked as Advisor (Urban Development), TERI (The Energy and Resources Institute) and Visiting Professor, TERI University, New Delhi from 2006 to 2014. He served for about 7 years (1997 to 2004) as the Director of National Institute of Urban Affairs (NIUA), New Delhi, an autonomous body, supported by the Ministry of Urban

Development, Government of India, and an apex Institute engaged in policy research, training, and information dissemination in the various areas of the urban sector. As Director of NIUA, Dr. Tewari closely interacted with Government of India (Ministry of Urban Development, Ministry of Urban Employment and Poverty Alleviation, Planning Commission, Department of Economic Affairs etc.) and worked with them on urban policy formulation, municipal reforms, urban development programme implementation and evaluation. He also worked with a number of state and municipal governments in the country, and international agencies like the World Bank, ADB, USAID, UNICEF, CIDA, WHO, UNDP on research studies, capacity building activities, policy advocacy, and carrying out projects sponsored by them relating to various aspects of Urban Development.

Before joining as Director NIUA in July 1997, Professor Tewari has served as Dean/Professor/Associate Professor, Indian Institute of Management, Bangalore (IIMB), (1980-98), Visiting Professor at the Asian Institute of Technology, Bangkok (1995-97), Fulbright Professor, University of Iowa, USA (1980), Associate Professor, Institute for Social and Economic Change, Bangalore (1973-80), and Quantitative Planner, The Ford Foundation, New Delhi (1972-73).

He has received individual research/consultancy grants from several international and national agencies including National Science Foundation (NSF), USA, World Bank, Washington DC, Asian Development Bank, Manila, Ford Foundation, New Delhi, UNDP, New York, UN-HABITAT, Nairobi, UNCRD, Nagoya, Konrad Adnauer Foundation, Germany, various Ministries of Government of India, and national financial institutions.

Dr. Tewari has been the Team Leader/Member Consultant for a number of nationally and internationally funded projects in the spheres of Municipal Reforms, Urban Infrastructure Development, Public Health, Urban Poverty, Urban Planning, and GIS based Planning and Management. He was Team Leader at Ernst and Young, New Delhi for a DFID project on Monitoring and Evaluation of MPUSP programme. He has also been an Advisor to UN-Habitat, Nairobi and contributed to the State of the World's Cities Report 2009/2010. During 2007-08, he was appointed an International Consultant by the Asian Development Bank to work for updating a strategy report on Reducing Poverty in Urban India under the ADB TA 4780-IND on Knowledge Management and Capacity Building. He was also involved as an International Institutional Expert in a JBIC supported Special Assistance for Project Implementation in the cities of Agra, Amritsar, and Bhubneswar with particular focus on water and sanitation sector.

Dr Tewari worked as Team Leader for the project - City Development Plan for Lucknow, sponsored by Water and Sanitation Programme (WSP) – SA of the World Bank, New Delhi. The CDP for Lucknow was formulated as per the guidelines of the Jawaharlal Nehru National Urban Renewal Mission (JNNURM), a reform linked Mission-mode project of Government of India for urban infrastructure development in selected cities in the country.

He has worked as Senior Institutional Expert on the AUSAID funded Gangtok and Shillong South Asia Regional Water Supply and Sanitation Program. As Institutional expert with Feedback Ventures from August 2006-January 2007, he provided inputs for the institutional component of the Reform Action Plan for six municipalities in Haryana, under the Yamuna Action Plan (YAP) II project supported by JBIC. He has been the International Consultant to the World Bank, Washington for a Study on Residential Rent Control Reforms in Bangalore City.

During his tenure at NIUA (1997-2004), the Government of India embarked upon a number of innovative Urban Sector Reforms, which required him to work closely with the Central Government, a number of State Governments and Urban Local Bodies in the formulation and implementation of Municipal Reforms. These include various aspects of Reforms in Property Tax Assessment and Administration, Municipal Accounting and Financial Reporting Systems, Citizens Charters for Urban Local Bodies, Implementation of the Provisions of the Constitution 74th Amendment Act, Urban Development Programmes in the Tenth Five year Plan, Regional Plan 2021 for the National Capital Region, Master Plan of Delhi 2021, guidelines for Tax Free Municipal Bonds, Urban Reforms Incentive Fund (URIF), City Challenge Fund (CCF), Pool Finance Development Fund (PFDF), E-Governance in Municipalities, Jawaharlal Nehru National Urban Renewal Mission, Strategies of Urban Poverty Alleviation and Training and Capacity Building of officials and elected members of Urban Local Bodies.

As Project Director from the nodal agency NIUA, for the Technical Assistance Project, the Financial Institutions Reforms and Expansion-Debt (FIRE-D), supported by USAID and Government of India, from 1997 to 2004, he coordinated the activities of all the project partners of this major technical assistance project and directed the activities assigned to NIUA which involved policy advocacy, training and capacity building, impact analysis, benchmark studies and information dissemination.

As a faculty member at IIMB, Professor Tewari has taught courses in post-graduate and Ph. D. level teaching programmes and short-term training programmes related to urban policy, urban management, quantitative urban modelling, public policy, geographic information systems, and research methodology. His training activities at IIM Bangalore, Asian Institute of Technology and National Institute of Urban Affairs were focused on building the capacities of urban development professionals, administrative service officials, elected representatives of municipal bodies, and the institutions engaged in the provision of urban infrastructure and services. In the area of training and capacity building, Dr Tewari has been instrumental in developing a network of training institutions in the country that have been successfully delivering the training and capacity building activities to municipal bodies and personnel.

He has published a number of books/reports (with publishers such as Johns Hopkins University Press, Concept publishers, Allied publishers, and World Bank) and a number of research papers on topics related to his areas of interest in refereed journals including Regional Development Dialogue, International Regional Science Review, Environment & Planning B: Planning & Design, IIMB Management Review, Geographical Review of India, Problems de Croissance Urbaine dans le Monde Tropical, CEGET, Sankhya, and Analytical Geography, and in the reports of the National Commission on Urbanisation, Government of India, World Bank, Washington and UNCRD, Nagoya.

For his pioneering work in the area of GIS and service planning in India during the 1980s, he received Geodyssey Award of Geodyssey Environmental GIS Research Initiative instituted by Autodesk Inc., Ca, USA, and Environmental Systems Research

Institute (ESRI), Inc., Redlands, Ca, USA in March 1993. The award was “designed to promote and encourage the use of desktop GIS technology and generate awareness that this technology has wide applicability in the areas of environmental research and management.”
