Abstract

The lecture will explore the consequences and antecedents of deception and fraud in the supply chain. This covers a span of topics relating to the quality of products and their safety (effect on human health/well-being and the environment) from both an operational and marketing perspectives. Some of the antecedents and drivers are explored along with the real-world operational and financial consequences.

Dr Wood's research investigates the design of sustainable operational systems, improving sustainable and social outcomes through operations and supply chain management practices. His work has particular applications in the construction and logistics sectors and healthcare delivery systems.
