Title: The effect of competition in contests: A unifying approach

Abstract:

We develop a new methodology for analyzing contests among symmetric agents under complete or incomplete information, based on characterizing equilibrium effort in terms of the probability of outperforming an arbitrary opponent. This approach enables tractable analysis of all-pay contests with finite type-spaces, where we show that the (most-competitive) winner-takes-all contest maximizes both total and maximum effort under linear or concave costs, thereby resolving an open question. However, increasing competition by making prizes more unequal need not raise effort, as we uncover an interior discouragement effect when relatively inefficient types are sufficiently common. An experiment provides qualitative support for these findings. Our techniques apply broadly and may be especially useful in settings where mixed equilibria hinder analysis.
