DIRECTOR'S FOREWORD

Accounting for almost a sixth of humankind, and increasingly a key player in the global economy, India is an important arena for business and social innovation. Fellow turned Doctor: The journey of the doctoral programme at IIMB

close engagement of the author, initially as a student and later as a faculty member, with the programme.

The programme was initiated as the Fellow Programme in Management (FPM) in 1976, just two years after the introduction of the Post Graduate Programme (PGP) in 1974. IIMB itself was inaugurated in 1973, as the third Indian Institute of Management, following the establishment of IIMs in Ahmedabad and Calcutta in the early '60s. Those were the early years of management education in India, and the paucity of context relevant content and

curriculum, pedagogy, teaching materials and not least, management teachers, was deeply felt by the few institutions that were attempting to pioneer management education. Also, IIIMB had articulated its founding

mission as aiming to inculcate modern management principles and practices in the undermanaged sectors of the economy such as agriculture and rural development, health, transportation, energy and power, habitat and environment, and education. The problem of lack of relevant content and course materials stood aggravated by this sectoral focus. It is not surprising that IIMB launched the doctoral level research programme to train and groom management teachers and develop relevant content through rigorous research to address the problems specific to the 'public sector'- a collective name that was ascribed to the group of undermanaged sectors as most, if not all, of them were functioning under the ambit of the

government. The programme was named the Fellow Programme in Management (FPM) in line with the norms established by the two earlier IIMs, with due consideration to the government policy that provided the structure and legitimacy to IIMs vis a vis other institutions offering graduate level education under the umbrella of the University Grants Commission. The early recognition of the Fellow programme as a Doctoral level programme came from the

Association of Indian

In the early years, the programme structure was influenced heavily by the

need to provide a strong grounding to the students in the functional areas of management before they embarked on focused research on a specific management problem that each of the sectors faced at the time. Since many of the students were new to the field of management with undergraduate or post graduate degrees in disciplines other than management, this requirement influenced the admission process as well as the programme structure. Applicants were put through a selection process quite similar to the PGP, but with the addition of a Research Aptitude Test and an interview to a demanding research programme.

Given the limited faculty resources, the students admitted to the programme went through two years of course work to gain an understanding of the management subjects, mostly along with PGP students with the exception of research focused courses. The overall programme duration was set at four years, and the students were granted financial support in the form of a fellowship to sustain themselves. In the first four years of the programme, between 1976 and 1979, 27 students were admitted and were in various stages of the programme.

The early course correction

The first review of the programme appears to have happened as early as in 1980-81. A committee comprising a few faculty and outside experts was supposed to have reviewed the policies and procedures of the programme.

Pending this review, the programme took a holiday in 1980, the year in which no student was admitted. While the actual recommendations stemming out of this review remain untraceable, one can only surmise that this review would have triggered streamlining

of the policies, particularly with respect to the later stages of the programme as more students were entering the dissertation phase. In the mid-'80s, the public sector orientation of the institute derived from its mission to serve the undermanaged sectors of the economy itself was under reconsideration, mainly due to the less than enthusiastic support from the key stakeholders - the public sector organisations and the students. Consequently, the FPM embraced Business and Industry as an area of specialisation in 1986, in addition to the sectoral specialisations mentioned above. Thus, the first student specialising in international management graduated in 1991. So, after 15 years of its inception, the Fellow programme started graduating students with specialisation in functional areas of management, going beyond

the sectors. Progressively, specialisation in individual sectors got phased out and functional specialisations came to the fore. The sectoral focus, albeit with modifications, returned later as a specialisation when public policy emerged as an area of specialisation In the programme in 2007 after the establishment of the Centre for Public Policy.

The formal review of the FPM for which records are available can be traced to 1991. The later reviews of the FPM refer to the 1991 review as the first review. A reading of the recommendations of the 1991 review seems to indicate that the predominant focus of the review was on streamlining the processes under a well-defined stage wise structure of the programme such as course work, comprehensive examination, composition of DAC, proposal preparation and finally the dissertation and its defence. The recommendations also included time limits for completing each stage of the programme by the student. On all other aspects such as admission

criteria, admission process etc., this review did not recommend any significant changes. An interesting recommendation was formalising the exemption from the first year of course work covering the core management subjects to those students who had undergone the PGP

from one of the four IIMs. Perhaps, the most interesting aspect of this review was the articulation of the objectives of the programme as: (i) to provide doctoral level educational facilities for interested candidates, (ii) to develop teachers, researchers and consultants in different areas of management and socially relevant public systems, (iii) to add to the body of knowledge through research, both applied and conceptual, and to disseminate such knowledge and, (iv) to contribute to the formulation, implementation and evaluation of public policies. These restated objectives reflect the gradual transition in focus from the sectoral to the general management and an added emphasis on creation of knowledge through research. Interestingly, a separate FPM office was created following this review to provide exclusive

administrative focus and support to the programme.

Aligning the foundations to the emerging

The next major review of the programme was initiated in 1998, which is referred to within IIMB as the second review of the FPM. The context and timing of the review is important to understand the approach and recommendations of this second review. The liberalisation and globalisation process initiated in the economic sphere of India had acquired significant

global attention Bangalore city started garnering due to the rapid growth of the IT sector, IIMB found itself being compared to the best management schools in the world. The demand for management education was increasing within the country and along with it the need for contextually rich content and well-trained teachers. While these factors were not explicitly mentioned in the second review report of 1998, one could infer their influence in the approach and recommendations of the report.

To start with, it was recommended that the admission process should allow for the aspirants to present their credentials through exams other than CAT, such as GMAT, GRE and GATE. Applicants who had completed PGP were also exempted from CAT. The Research Aptitude Test and a personal interview were retained as mechanisms to assess interest in and aptitude for research. These measures were aimed at not only widening the pool of applicants to choose from but also to ensure the selection of students

with a demonstrated interest in pursuing a career as researchers. All the administrative aspects of the programme as well as the content of the programme, particularly the core courses common to all students, were formalised in greater detail to impart a higher level of discipline in the conduct of the programme on the part of both the institute and the students. It was also significant that the committee dropped the objective of contributing to the formulation, implementation and evaluation of public policies, perhaps to sharpen the focus of the programme to the functional areas around business and industry. The recommendation also included an increase in stipend enhancement of contingency grant to each student.

Shifting gears to enhance quality of research

The next review, referred to as the third review, was completed in 2009. The recommendations arising out of this review were pathbreaking in the sense that they contributed to the establishment of a clear and distinctive identity for the programme

and almost completely decoupled the programme from the more visible PGP. Drawing from the vision document adopted by the IIMB in 2008 after an elaborate exercise, this review laid down the core philosophy of the programme as the creation and nurturing of research focus and articulated the vision of the programme thus: "The fellowship programme equips doctoral students for rigorous research and develops scholars who shape management and public policy thought". This review also pointed to the fact that research capability was becoming a major criterion for recruitment of faculty in business schools, and given the increasing focus on research within IIMB, the FPM was critical to setting the agenda for the institution as a whole and the individual faculty.

In order to operationalise this vision and focus, many pathbreaking recommendations were made by this review. Firstly, the FPM was

decentralised in the sense of each functional specialisation area owning the programme and the FPM office playing a facilitating role to ensure the consistency of the programme quality across all areas. The responsibility for planning for the programme, the number of students to be admitted, the admission process, offering courses totalling to the required credit norms and managing all stages of the programme for each candidate was placed on the areas, and sought to provide common guidelines to ensure some level of uniformity across areas. The FPM course, both core and electives, was completely delinked from the PGP, and a broad structure was provided for the course work by creating separate buckets of courses such as research enabling courses, basic discipline courses, breadth courses and dissertation and allied area courses. The curriculum design was laid out in considerable detail, and the objectives, methods and evaluation were specified clearly for each year of the programme. The recommendations also sought to help the students to start on their research in the first year of the programme itself, and introduced required components such as the development of publishable quality research papers in the first and second years. The recommendations also formalised teaching and research assistance to enhance the overall profile of the students.

This review also streamlined financial assistance and ensured that students received financial support for five years so that they could reasonably expect to graduate before the financial support expired.

As the implementation of the recommendations of the third review progressed, the ascending trajectory of both the rigour and vibrancy of the programme became visible. In order to consolidate this trajectory, a fourth review of the programme was undertaken in 2015. This review focused on benchmarking the programme with programmes of leading schools across the globe and recommending changes to further enhance the research focus of the curriculum as well as other support systems for the research students.

The most significant recommendation arising out of this review was the reduction of course credits from 72 to 54 and the reduction in overall credit requirements of the programme from 168 to 135.

It was also recommended that the four course buckets be reduced to two to simplify the course structure. Another important recommendation of this review was the introduction of an exit option with a Certificate in Management Research to those students who successfully complete the course work with specified performance levels but are unable to meet the required standards for progressing to the dissertation phase. This review also recommended the enhancement of the stipend and other financial support in the form of contingency grants and conference travel grant to bring them in line with other institutions in the country. There was a limited review of some aspects of the doctoral programme in 2020 and the recommendations brought more clarity to some operational aspects of the programme such as course administration and policies, and refining some aspects of the programme relating to research projects. However, the overall philosophy and structure of the doctoral programme as recommended by the 2009 and 2015 reviews was retained.

By far, the most significant development that had a positive impact on the programme was the provisions of the IIM Act 2017, notified in 2018, which allowed IIMB to grant the Ph.D. degree to the graduating students from 2018 onwards. It is interesting to note that that the third review in 2009 had recommended that the institute should strongly pursue the process to offer a Ph.D. However, these efforts had to await the regulatory changes that were effected in 2018.

In retrospect: Programme outcomes and achievements

As IIMB turned 50, the doctoral programme turned 48. It will not be out of place to reflect on what the fellow or doctoral programme has accomplished, both for the institute and for the community of management scholars. The fellow programme also derived its mandate from IIMB's early vision to support the public sector, also referred to as the undermanaged sectors of the economy. The early purpose and objective of the programme were rooted in this local context, and on the back of the huge gap to be filled in terms of developing relevant knowledge about the management problems of each of the sectors

and using that knowledge to contribute to better management of those sectors. Many faculty were recruited with expertise in those sectors. The topics of dissertations that graduating students worked on in each of the sectors reveal this contextual focus. While the sectors were not quite receptive to the ideas and inputs from management institutes like IIMB, some of the early graduates from the programme made significant contributions to sectors such as energy, habitat, transportation, health and agriculture. Though the numbers were few, these students could build a lifelong career within those sectors, which to some extent speaks for the skills and interest developed in the students to serve those sectors. The sectoral focus was slowly winding down in the '80s, but the programme did initiate the process of opening itself out to functional areas in the latter half of that decade. Many students who graduated with sectoral specialisation in that decade pursued their academic career in functional areas while some of them entered industry in consulting roles.

As the programme became more structured and time bound in the '90s, it became more attractive to many aspiring students. As the management education expanded in the country during the '90s, many of the graduating students entered academia, and have contributed significantly to the pool of management teachers in the country. The industry was also expanding rapidly post liberalisation in the '90s, and started providing attractive careers to graduating students as specialists, consultants and domain experts. These developments together assured the potential students of respectable career options and sustained the programme on a path of progress.

As IIMB stepped into the new millennium against the backdrop of globalisation, it was faced with the challenge of measuring up to the benchmarks that peer institutions across the globe were subscribing to. The rankings framework adopted to rank these institutions provided considerable weight to research orientation and output.

As IIMB sought to acquire international quality accreditations like EQUIS, the need for stepping up the research rigour and demonstrating that rigour through peer reviewed publications was also felt. In addition, with the network of IIMs expanding, and management schools outside the IIMB system raising their aspirations, commitment to research and an enabling environment for research became a differentiator to attract good quality faculty and doctoral students. It is to IIMB's credit that it recognised the role of the doctoral programme as the galvaniser of research and brought about sufficient rigour to the programme to attract meritorious students and outstanding faculty interested in research. It is equally significant that in many of the newer IIMs in the expanded community of IIMs - in addition to other private institutions -- the graduates of IIMB's doctoral programme contribute significantly to faculty strength and quality.

Another measure of the improving quality of IIMB's doctoral programme is the publication records of the students and alumni. The programme continues to imbibe the scholarly spirit of publishing in reputed journals, as can be gleaned from the list of publications from the current and former students. While recognising that achieving excellence is a moving target, IIMB can reasonably feel proud of the journey of its doctoral programme so far and its accomplishments.

The doctoral students are special. They truly changed my way of thinking, my way of speaking, and perhaps my entire personality!


