To mark 25 years of India-Israel partnership, the Israeli Consulate in Bengaluru launched the Israel Centre at Indian Institute of Management Bangalore (IIMB).

Ambassador of Israel to India Daniel Carmon said on the occasion, "It is natural for Bengaluru, India's innovation hub, to partner with Tel Aviv, a leading innovation hub."

G Raghuram, Director, IIMB, said, "Now with the new emphasis of the Indian government on promotion of entrepreneurial activity, the business and academic contacts between the countries assumed heightened significance. The change in Indian attitude and official stance coincided with Israel's search for revised geopolitical configuration."
